Audition Requirements

Vocal Selection:

- Must be Musical Theater or style matching the show in English
- Come prepared with a copy of music for our pianist
- You may also bring a background track (karaoke) with no other vocals
- You must provide a device to play it on, we will provide the sound system
- Singing without accompaniment is not allowed
- Please do not select a song from previous musicals or from The Sound of Music
- Selection must be memorized

Monologue:

- Monologue should be 1-3 minutes in length
- Monologue should not contain any profanity or inappropriate content
- Selection must be memorized

Attire:

- Dress to present your best self in the audition
- Jeans are appropriate but should not have holes
- Be comfortable and confident in what you wear

Audition Expectations

Before the Audition:

- Sign up for an audition online prior to December 13th
- Practice all material and come in prepared
- Fill out the audition form before entering the auditorium
- The form is attached to this packet and will be available online with the audition sign up
- Arrive early to collect yourself, get a drink, and relax
- Stay positive

During the Audition:

- Hand Mr. Logan your paper and give the pianist your music (if needed)
- Set up your background music through the sound system (if needed/we will help)
- Choose whether you would like to start with your song or monologue
- Relax and focus on doing your best

Things to avoid:

- Talking about a lack of preparation
- Talking negatively about yourself or your audition
- Speaking profanities or other inappropriate language

Stage Crew

Stage Crew is a group of students helping the production behind the scenes

Responsibilities:

- Assist with lights, sound, set construction, scene changes, makeup, and props
- Stay quiet backstage to not distract the audience or actors
- Must be able to move set pieces. Not all set pieces will be "heavy lifting"
- Must wear black backstage and stay quiet

Stage Manager (requires interview):

- Lead student of Stage Crew. Held by a student in high school
- Should have a minimum two years experience in Stage Crew or in Cast
- Will assist in rehearsals, planning, technology, and stage crew assignments
- Interviews will be held the first week of rehearsals (January 6-9)
- Contact Mr. Logan before December 20th for dates and times (email or Remind preferred)
